What is the Robert Shannon Foundation?

The Robert Shannon Foundation was founded in 2003 to perpetuate the memory of Robert Shannon, founder of Shannons Insurance, who died unexpectedly in March 2000.

Robert was an avid classic car enthusiast, who especially enjoyed his 1930 Invicta S Type. He was a strong supporter of the historic motoring movement and was concerned that it was not attracting enough younger people, particularly in the restoration and preservation of historic vehicles.

Our Aim

In 2001 the Australian Historic Motoring Federation (AHMF) established the Robert Shannon Foundation to provide encouragement for people under the age of 30 to become involved in the restoration and preservation of veteran, vintage and classic motor vehicles.

To achieve this, the **Foundation may**:

1. Help with the purchase of specialist tools or equipment,
2. Assist with the actual cost of the restoration work,
3. Contribute toward TAFE or tertiary fees, or
4. Contribute toward any project considered worthwhile by the Trustees.
